How to deliver data on the implementation of the Emissions Trading Directive through Reportnet

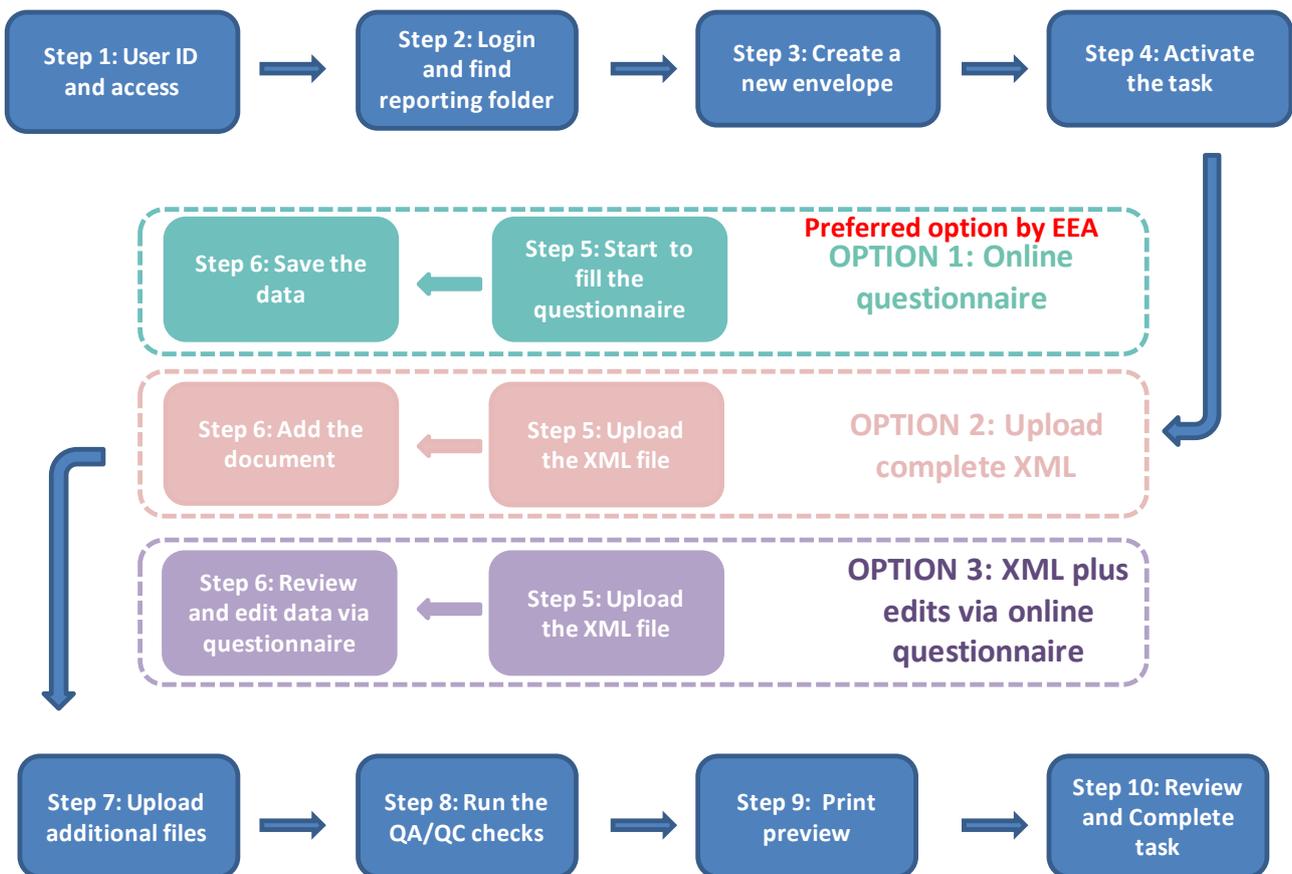
(Information relating to Emission Trading Directive 2003/87/EC Article 21)

These guidelines explain how to use the electronic infrastructure for reporting information to the European Commission in pursuance of Article 21 of the Emissions Trading Directive (2003/87/EC).

How to deliver

All deliveries are provided via the Reportnet Central Data Repository (CDR), which is maintained by the European Environment Agency (EEA).

Summary of the delivery process





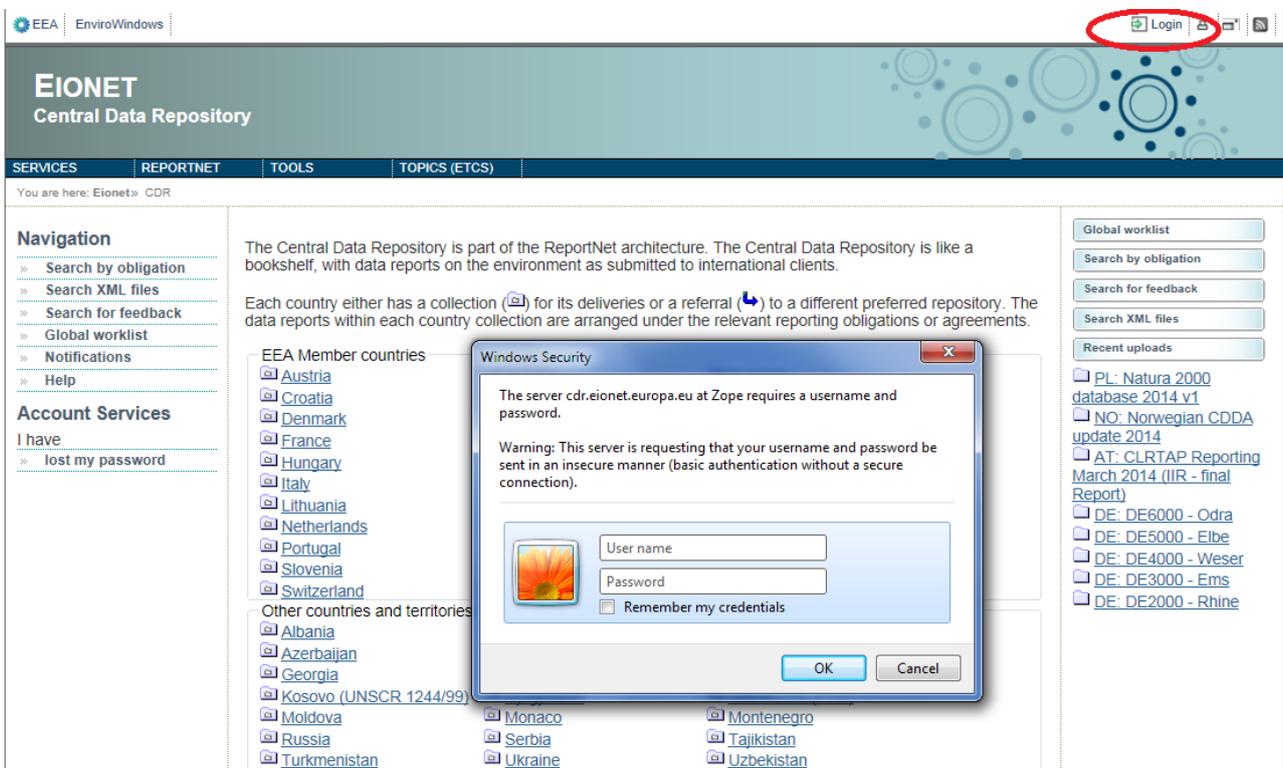
➤ **Step 1: User accounts and access permissions**

In order to report, an Eionet account with user name and password is required as well as permission to upload the national delivery. Please inform DG CLIMA and EEA about who will be the person(s) responsible for the reporting, so that the necessary arrangements can be made. The person(s) who do not yet have an EIONET account will receive an e-mail with their EOINET login and password. All persons nominated as reporter will receive upload rights to the CDR. Only new reporters will receive a notification on this from the Eionet Helpdesk (helpdesk@eionet.europa.eu).

➤ **Step 2: Login to the Central Data Repository and open your folder**

You can access EEA’s Central Data Repository (CDR) at <http://cdr.eionet.europa.eu>

When preparing for the EU ETS Article 21 questionnaire delivery, you first have to log in by using your Eionet user name and password and then navigate to the respective folder of your country (see the links below).

➤ Step 3: Create a new envelope

Now **create a new envelope** which will contain your data delivery by clicking on the button 'New envelope' at the upper right corner of the screen:

Provide meaningful metadata about your delivery on the "Add Envelope" page. At least "Title" and "Relating to which year" fields have to be filled in.

The Envelope title should briefly summarise the delivery by providing the information about the reporting country, obligation and year. Then it will be easier for the reporter and other stakeholders to find the delivery. "Relating to which year" indicates the period the report will cover. The report to be delivered in June 2016 is for the year 2015.



For reporting of 2015 data, a **pre-filled questionnaire** will appear in your envelope. This has been created by the EEA and ETC/ACM by pre-filling those questions in the envelopes on CDR that are not required to be answered every year if there have been no changes since the last reporting period. The input for this exercise were the most recent country responses from the previous reporting round. These responses of course need to be carefully checked. If the data has changed since the last reporting period, these must be updated. If there have been no changes, the data can be left the same. Empty questions must be completed as normal.

➤ Step 4: Activate the task

The way to start the work in the envelope is to enter the envelope and activate the **Draft** task by clicking on the *<Activate task: Draft>* link or by pressing the *<Activate task>* button.

Activating means that you have reserved the envelope for yourself to work on. Other users will not be able to modify it until the envelope is deactivated or released. Your new envelope is now in Draft status and files can be added.

➤ Step 5: Report data

You have three options to enter data and submit your delivery in the CDR envelope:

- Option 1: fill out the online questionnaire;
- Option 2: upload a completed XML file;
- Option 3: upload a partially completed XML file and continue to edit the file using the online questionnaire.

Option 1 is the preferred option by the EEA.

These options apply to Steps 5 and 6 and are explained in turn in the next few pages.

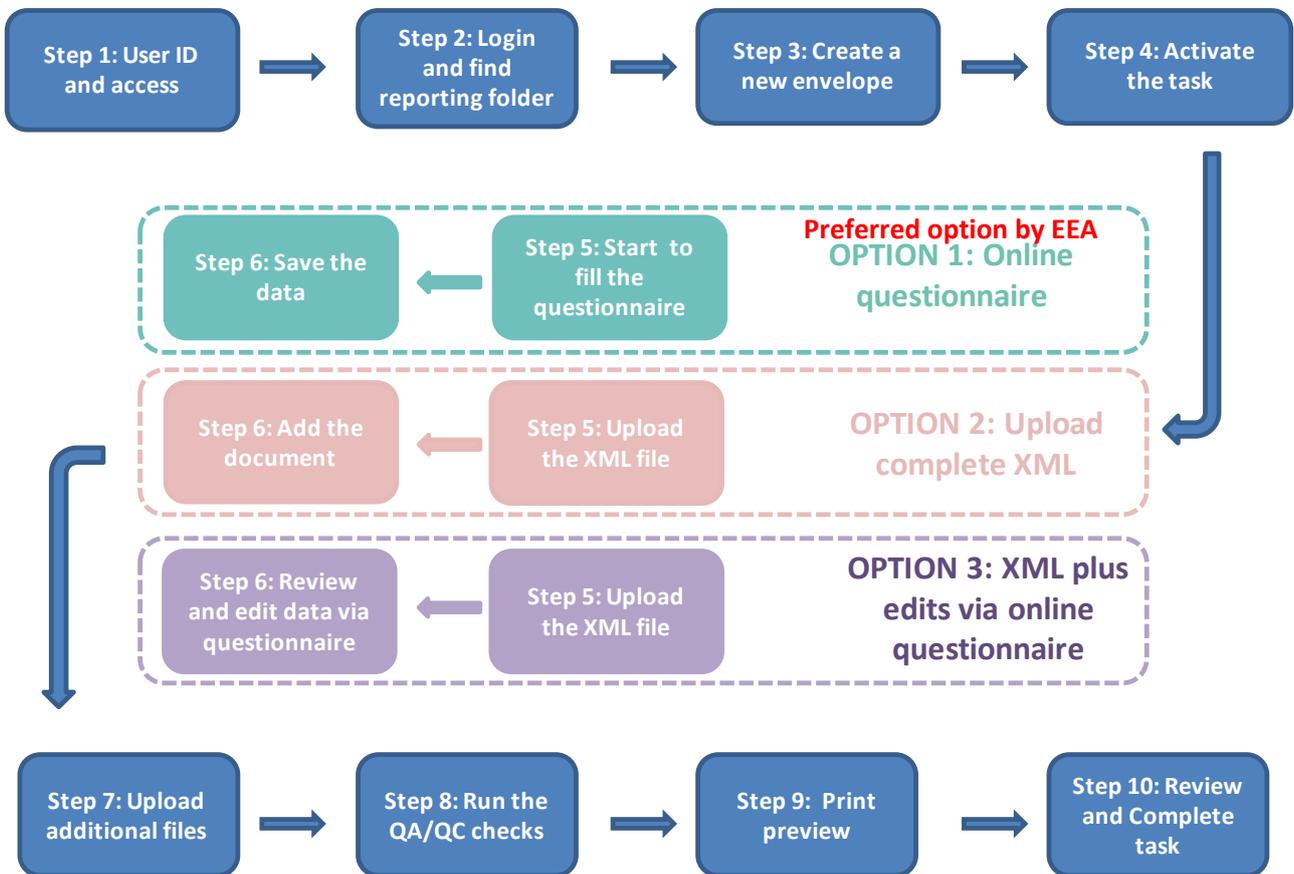

Introduction Top navigation bar

Each year the Member States shall submit to the Commission a report on the application of the Emissions Trading Directive. That report shall pay particular attention to the arrangements for the allocation of allowances, the operation of registries, the application of the implementing measures on monitoring and reporting, verification and accreditation and issues relating to compliance with this Directive and on the fiscal treatment of allowances, if any. The first report shall be sent to the Commission by 30 June 2005. The report shall be drawn up on the basis of a questionnaire or outline drafted by the Commission in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 6 of Directive 91/692/EEC. The questionnaire or outline shall be sent to Member States at least six months before the deadline for the submission of the first report.

The reporting guidelines are set up in the following Commission Implementing Decision: *2014/166/EU: Commission Implementing Decision of 21 March 2014 amending Decision 2005/381/EC as regards the questionnaire for reporting on the application of Directive 2003/87/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council (notified under document C(2014) 1726) Text with EEA relevance*

On the basis of these reports the Commission shall publish a report on the application of the Emissions Trading Directive within three months of receiving the reports from the Member States (cf. Directive 2003/87/EC (Article 21 (2))).

General principles of using the online questionnaire

The questionnaire is divided into multiple forms (Intro, Q1 – Q14, Explanatory notes) and it has some common areas which are always visible.

Navigation

- All the forms are accessible from the **top navigation bar** (tabs) below the questionnaire title. The active form tab is displayed in bold font.
- The **bottom navigation bar** under the reporting form contains links to the **next** and **previous** forms. After filling in one form you don't have to scroll on top of the page, but you can continue by clicking on the **Next** button.
- The **bottom navigation bar** with **action buttons** can be turned invisible by clicking on the left most orange "<" button. This feature is useful in case you have a small screen and you want to make more space for questions. The bottom navigation bar and action buttons can be restored by clicking green ">" button in the same location.

Reporting forms

- **Intro** – the opening form with introduction texts asking for generic information about the questionnaire.
- **Q1 ... Q14** – questions 1 to 14 in the questionnaire on the implementation of Directive 2003/87/EC
- **Explanatory notes** – detailed guidance of how to answer the specific questions

Language selections

- **Questions language** - if you prefer to read the questions in any official language then use the language selection in top right corner
- **Reporting language** – Please state the language that is used for reporting using the field on the *Intro* page accordingly. If the report is a translation of the official report, then indicate it on *Intro* page by selecting "*This is a translation of the official report*", otherwise please select "*This is the official report*". There is no obligation to provide a translation. If two reports are submitted in this way they should both be submitted in the same envelope (see Step 7).

Action buttons

- **Save** – saves the data in the CDR envelope in an XML file. All the input fields are validated before saving the file. The form warns you when you try to save invalid data. All errors are displayed in red.
- **Turn validation On/Off** – you can turn the validation on and off at any time to see if inserted data follow the rules. Validation is turned on automatically every time you save the form.
- **Close** – closes the online questionnaire and goes back to CDR envelope, after prompting you to save if necessary.
- **Print preview** – opens the questionnaire in printable format in a new window. NB You need to disable the pop-up blocker for this site if it is turned on.



Data validation

The form validates inserted data instantly. The input field is coloured red and respective error messages appear next to the field, if the inserted value does not follow the validation rule. The input field turns green if the value is inserted correctly. The tab on the top navigation bar is coloured red if the respective form contains invalid data.

Further QA/QC checks are implemented when data are saved (see above regarding action buttons) and when the envelope is released (see Step 8).

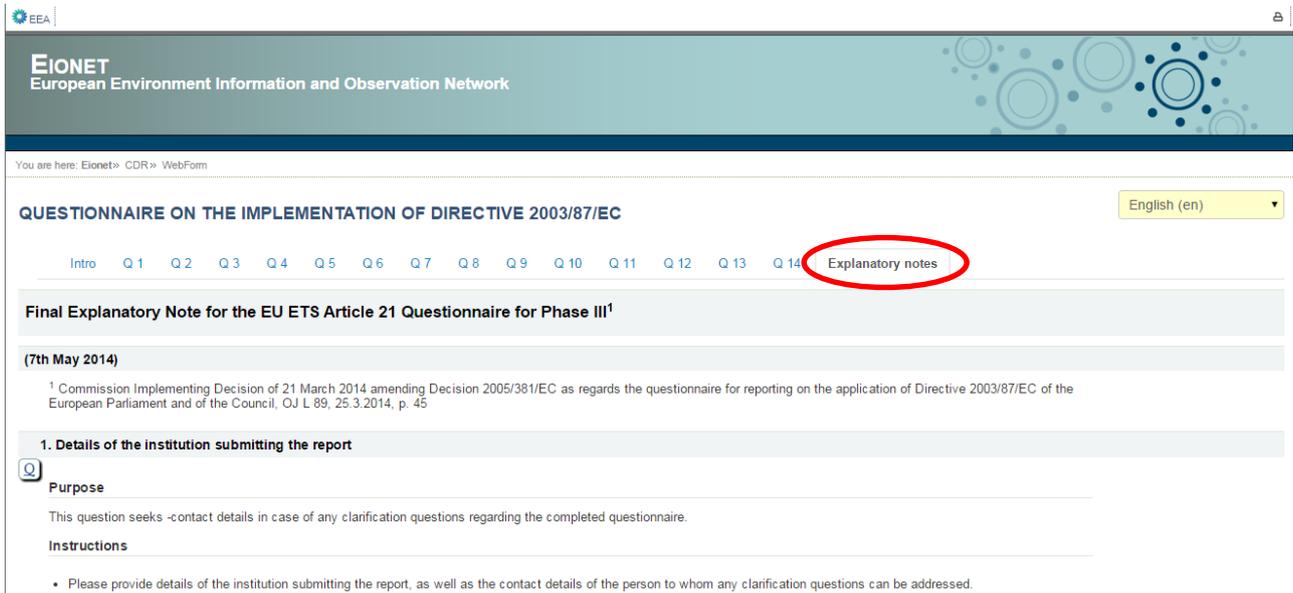

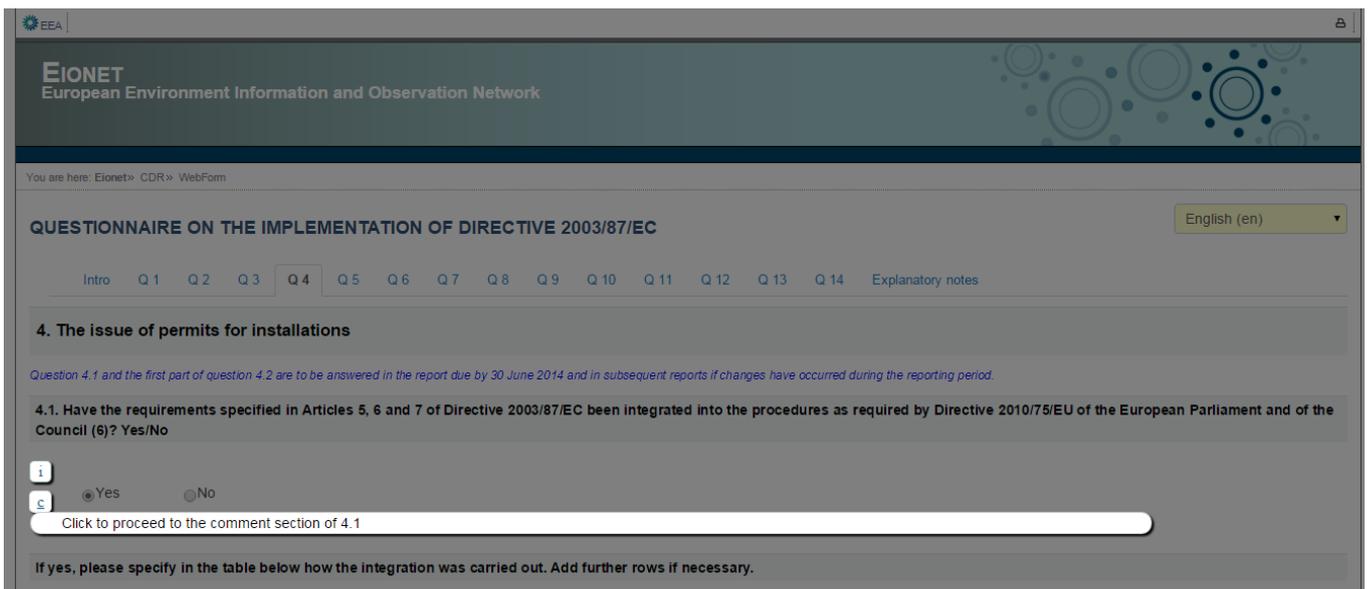

Add further rows

There are several questions that request further rows to be added if necessary in the questionnaire. This can be achieved by clicking the **“Add new”** button on the bottom of the question table. A new empty row will be added to the table. If you have entered any row accidentally and you want to remove it, then press the **“Remove”** button. All the data will be removed in the selected row after confirmation.

Excel copy-paste functionality

For some of the questions involving potentially large tables of data it is now possible to copy and paste in data from excel by clicking the **“Import multiple rows”** button next to the **“Add rows”** button. This is possible for questions 5.6, 5.7, 5.10, 5.13, 5.14, 5.18, 6.3, 6.4, 6.7, and 7.3.

An entry table will appear, and data can be copied from excel and pasted into the table.

To match with the xml schema, some fields need to be entered in the same codes as the schema. For example, instead of choosing the CRF category for each row from the drop-down box in question 5.6, the code for the CRF category can be copied into the data table. A lookup of codes and names is available in the [appendix](#) to this document.

Data entered in these tables are subject to the same data validations as the web form. If you enter text into a number only field in the table, it will be left empty once you click **“Done”**. After the data are pasted in the Excel Grid, the button **“Done”** saves them and returns to the normal view, while the button **“Cancel”** returns to the normal view without saving the pasted data.

Answering “If yes, ...” and “If no, ...” questions

There are several questions that vary depending on the answer to the previous question in the questionnaire. These questions are hidden by default and only be visible if they are relevant. For example, if you answer Yes to question 5.1, then the next question *“If yes, please specify below for which areas additional national legislation has been implemented”* will appear automatically and it is mandatory to answer it. If you change your previous answer to No, then the *“If yes, ...”* field will be removed after confirmation.

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Additional comments on some questions

Installation codes presented for certain questions can be made anonymous if necessary, using fake Installation IDs. A lookup file (in simple text or Excel) can be added to the envelope with no public access (see Step 7) to explain the meaning of the fake IDs.

Changes to the questionnaire layout

There have been slight modifications of the web form in 2016:

- All questions: any numbers entered with a thousand separator (e.g. “,” or “.”) will not be accepted by the webform. Any numbers with a “,” used for a decimal place, will be replaced with a “.” For example, “1234,56” will be replaced with “1234.56”, but “1,234.56” and “1.234,56” will not be accepted.
- Question 5.6, on emissions by CRF category, now uses IPCC 2006 Guidelines CRF categories, for data reported for 2015 and later (i.e. 2016 submissions and later). If a user is resubmitting an old year e.g. 2014 data, the previous CRF categories will be used.
- Question 5.10, on method tiers applied, now has the option of ‘no tier’
- Question 6.8, on issues with aircraft verification reports, has had the validation fixed so it no longer requests answers to both emission reports and tonne-kilometre reports
- Questions 5.13, 6.3, 6.4, 6.7 now have the option to import multiple rows.

Clarifications:



- Question 3.1, on number of installations – please give the maximum number of active installations throughout the year (excluding installations closed before reporting year, excluded through Article 27, but inclusive of new entrants)
- Question 8.1, on number of allocation changes – please report on the number of changes actually occurring (i.e. not on the number of changes planned, or the deviation from planned changes). “In the reporting period” refers to the year of data reporting (in this instance, 2015) and the year in which the corresponding change of allocation is made in the Registry, “since the start of the third trading period” refers to all changes since the start in 2013.

Appendix

Excel Import Functionality Guide

After clicking “**Import Multiple Rows**”, only the Excel grid will be made visible (and the normal view temporarily disappears). The reporter can paste the data in the grid and click “**Done**” or “**Cancel**”. “Done” will paste the values inside the normal view and the Excel grid will disappear. Every time the “Import Multiple Rows” is clicked again, the additional data will be added to the bottom of the table.

NB! Beware of the limitations: if a text string is entered in the Excel grid for a field that should contain only numbers, the text string will disappear when “Done” is clicked. Moreover, for the fields containing multiple options, the reporter will have to use the appropriate codes so that the fields are correctly filled. The following tables show the matching between the codes and the labels, so that reporters can easily understand which codes should be inserted in the Excel grid for each question. The limitations on various fields are also visible.

NB! New validation for 2016 reporting: if a number string is entered with any thousand separator during the “Import multiple rows” function, the number will be disappear when “Done” is clicked. If a comma is entered in a number string, it will change to a decimal place.
