Notification: Reporting on Large Combustion Plants (LCPs) in connection to the Energy Community Treaty

Dear colleagues,

This message addresses you as reporter on combustion plants (LCPs) according to the agreements made under the Energy Community Treaty. The European Environment Agency assists on this reporting exercise and this notification provides details on the cycle of submission in 2026.

Please remember that all reports shall be submitted through the reporting tool **by 31st March 2026 at the latest**.

Reporting tool – 2025 data

As you are aware from previous cycles, reports should be prepared using a Microsoft Excel™ sheet template (see below) and submitted to the EEA's Central Data Repository (CDR).

The main aspects to remember are:

1. The Excel templates [are available here](#). There is a template for each country. Each of the templates have been pre-filled in with the list of plants used in your last submission
2. Reports for each country are to be submitted to CDR (<https://cdr.eionet.europa.eu/>) by opening a “new envelope” in your country folder under the collection “Energy community - Reporting on Combustion Plants”
3. Please note that you need to identify your plants using the same identifiers that were used in the previous year's exercise. Should you need assistance with that, please write to my colleague Juan Calero (juan.calero@eea.europa.eu)

Resubmissions of corrected data for previous years

Should a country wish to correct data from previous years, please use the same template and open a folder for the relevant year. Please note that identifiers of the same plants across years should be the same, so just ensure that there is continuity if you correct any year.

Access to the tool and reporter rights

An **Eionet account** is required to access the tool. Your account needs also specific permissions to upload the national delivery for this dataflow. The current accounts that can be used for this reporting are those included in the **extranet list for LCP reporting by Energy Community members** (https://www.eionet.europa.eu/ldap-roles?role_id=extranet-energycommunity, requires Eionet login).

Please do contact us in case the users listed for your country are no longer the ones in charge of the inventory.
