Request for information on mapping between LCP and EU Registry installation part identifiers

Dear colleagues,

At the end of August 2019 the EEA circulated a notification to the designated reporters for the EU Registry and E-PRTR/LCP Integrated Reporting data flows in relation to the proposed approach for mapping of data from the existing E-PRTR and LCP databases into the databases created to support the new data flows. You can find the details of the notification [here](#). You should consult this note for further background information.

The deadline for submission of the LCP mapping information from countries is: **March 31 2020**.

The timing for provision of data on this mapping is designed to coincide with the first reporting deadline for submissions to the thematic E-PRTR and LCP integrated reporting. For the purposes of this mapping, the only information which we require from reporters is as follows:

1. Provide a list of all InspireIDs reported for Installation Parts (such as LCPs) in the EU Registry submission for the 2017 reporting year. Based on the requirements of the EU Registry this should include all functional LCPs within your country at that time. This data should be provided in column A and B of the reporting template in the form of the localID and the namespace (not to be confused with the name of the plant).
2. For each of the InspireIDs reported under point 1, provide the PlantID used for LCP reporting. This should be the most recently reported PlantID for the plant under LCP reporting. If the plant does not have a PlantID then leave the field blank. This data should be provided in column C of the reporting template.
3. For each PlantID provided, reporters should also provide the E-PRTR NationalID that is associated with the plant in question.

Notes on providing mapping information:

- A template is provided for reporters to detail the above information. Please use this template and do not alter the template. The template is available [here](#).
- The InspireID should include both the LocalID and NameSpace, columns are provided in the template for both these fields. NameSpace should not be confused with the name of the plant.



- The PlantID may not be in your national register although it has been used to report LCP data in the past. You can find a record of the PlantID in your latest LCP submission under Art 72 of the IED (under [ROD obligation 756](#)) or in the [EEA public dataset](#) from this obligation. Please contact industry.helpdesk@eea.europa.eu in case you need assistance.
- If reporters have already provided this mapping in their EU Registry 2017 submission then they do not need to submit the excel spreadsheet. However, they should notify the EEA that they have reported the data already and which fields they used to do so.

How to submit your mapping file:

1. Complete the template provided. Do not make any changes to the layout of the template.
2. Name the file according to the convention [country code]lcpmapping.xls, e.g. 'PLlcpmapping.xls', 'FRlcpmapping.xls' or 'ROlcpmapping.xls'
3. Create a new envelope in the EU Registry data flow on CDR. Use the same naming convention for the envelope on CDR, e.g. 'PLlcpmapping'.
4. When creating the envelope, leave the 'year' fields blank.
5. If you wish to keep the submission from public view then make sure you select the option 'restricted from public view' when you are adding the file to the envelope.
6. Notify the EEA when you have submitted the mapping file. You can do this by emailing industry.helpdesk@eea.europa.eu.
